30 Day Bible Reading Plan

The Gospel of John

Author: The Apostle John, known as "the beloved disciple". He belonged to the inner circle of Jesus' followers.

Purpose: Stated in John 20:30-31, "And truly Jesus did many other signs in the presence of His disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing you may have life in His name." Be sure and look for the things that prove Jesus is the Son of God.

Philippians

Author: The Apostle Paul, written while in a Roman prison

Purpose: True joy is not dependent upon the circumstances of life. True joy comes through a personal, intimate relationship with Jesus Christ.

Colossians

Author: The Apostle Paul, written while in a Roman prison

Purpose: To establish the supremacy and Lordship of Jesus Christ over other philosophies and traditions. Colossians 2:8-10, "Beware lest anyone cheat you through philosophy and empty deceit, according to the tradition of men, according to the basic principles of the world, and not according to Christ. For in Him dwells all the fullness of the Godhead bodily; and you are complete in Him, who is the head of all principality and power."

1 John

Author: The Apostle John, known as "the beloved disciple". He belonged to the inner circle of Jesus' followers.

Purpose: Written to give security and assurance of eternal life to followers of Jesus Christ. 1 John 5:13, "These things I have written to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, that you may know that you have eternal life, and that you may continue to believe in the name of the Son of God."

2 John

Author: The Apostle John

Purpose: To encourage believers to walk in the truth of Jesus Christ and to reject false teachers.

3 John

Author: The Apostle John

Purpose: Letter has a fatherly tone to it. This illustrates how the Body of Christ is truly a family. He commends the generosity of Gaius and condemns the rebellious behavior of Diotrefes. 3 John 11, "Beloved, do not imitate what is evil, but what is good. He who does good is of God, but he who does evil has not seen God."
